


Do you long for healing and wholeness?

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children is January 23rd – the U.S. bishops ask us to observe a day of penitential prayer and fasting. "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, Jan 22 (or Jan 23, when Jan 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." (GIRM, no. 373) St. Francis Church in Teutopolis will have a special pro-life mass at 6:30 PM on Mon, Jan. 23rd. St. Francis' Eucharistic Adoration will pause at 6 PM, and a Rosary for Life will be recited prior to Mass. Eucharistic Adoration will resume in the chapel Immediately following Mass. The Mass readings for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A inspire us to think about the call to holiness and the need to declare that Jesus has died for our redemption. In the first reading, we hear one of the "Servant Songs". The psalm is a prayer of both thanksgiving and lament. The second reading evokes the call to holiness. The Gospel recalls the public actions of John the Baptist to identify Jesus as the Lamb of God. John the Baptist recalls the baptism of Jesus and that he saw the Spirit descend upon Jesus.

Today's readings pick up where the readings for the feast of the Baptism of Jesus left off.

#### Called In the Womb

We continue reading the Servant Songs from Isaiah. These were written during the Babylonian exile and provided hope for a people who had been ripped away from their homeland. This servant was called from the womb. This call before birth is also reflected by Jeremiah and by Paul. It points out that we have a bond with God from the time of conception.

#### The Lamb of God

John points out that Jesus is the Lamb of God, a sacrifice for our restoration. When we pray the "Lamb of God" at Mass, we should remember that Jesus willingly gave his life for us so that we could be redeemed. This tremendous act shows that all human life has dignity in the eyes of God.

### Reflection Questions---

Do I value all human life, from womb to tomb?

Am I aware of how much God loves all people, including the unborn, the homeless, the aged, the prisoner, the migrant, and all of those who are looked down upon by others?

What can I do today to affirm the dignity of another person? (Young-catholics.com)

## **Family Connection**

The ministry of John the Baptist prepared for and pointed to the ministry of Jesus. In a similar way, our lives are to offer testimony to who we know Jesus to be for us and for the world. Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. How does the witness of our lives give testimony to the reconciling presence of Christ?

As a family, identify as many titles for Jesus as possible, such as Lamb of God, Son of God, Prince of Peace, and so on. Talk together about what these different titles mean and what they tell you about Jesus. Then read together today's Gospel, John 1:29-34.

Consider how John the Baptist gives testimony to who Jesus is. Talk about what people might come to know about Jesus by observing your family life. Pray together that your family life will show others that Jesus is the Son of God, the lamb who takes away the sins of the world. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
