Living the Eucharist can sometimes be a challenge. In a recent homily from the Holy Father on the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31), Pope Francis teaches, "the Eucharist calls us to love our brothers and sisters. This Bread is the Sacrament of love par excellence. It is Christ who offers himself and breaks himself for us, and asks us to do likewise, so that our life may be ground wheat and become bread that feeds our brothers and sisters" [emphasis original]. How do we, as Catholics in the world today, become bread that feeds others?

One example of how we become bread for others is in the Pro-Life movement. Countless volunteers work at pregnancy centers that empower women to keep their babies, offering their time, talent and treasure as a way of becoming bread for others. Yet there are still challenges to living this message because many Catholics do not have a respect-for-life worldview, refusing to be bread of others.

Another example of being a Eucharistic people is how we serve others. We recently celebrated World Mission Sunday, an opportunity for Catholics to be united in celebration of our common vocation to mission, focusing on the Pope's missions around the world and the missionaries who dedicate themselves to their service. A challenge here is that most of us are not able to serve people in other countries, but we can still live the Eucharist by supporting these ministries in other ways.

One final challenge to living the Eucharist is simply a lack of faith. Not long ago, the Pew Research Center found that only about a third of Catholics believed in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. How can we offer ourselves as bread for others when we don't recognize Christ in the Eucharist ourselves? Much work needs to be done to help people understand why the Eucharist is so important in our lives.

As we continue on our journey toward a Eucharistic revival, I pray that more people will return to the Church so that the Eucharist can be the center of their lives once again.
