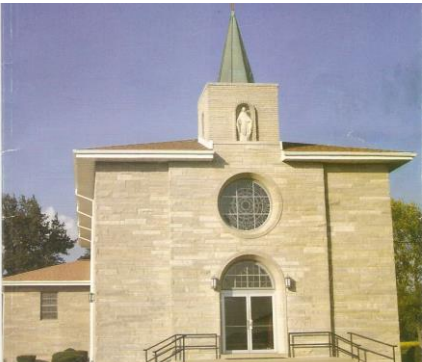

## Families in Faith

Lord God, as the election approaches, we seek to better understand the issues and concerns that confront our city/state/country, and how the Gospel compels us to respond as faithful citizens in our community. We ask for eyes that are free from blindness so that we might see each other as brothers and sisters, one and equal in dignity, especially those who are victims of abuse and violence, deceit and poverty. We ask for ears that will hear the cries of children unborn and those abandoned, Men and women oppressed because of race or creed, religion or gender. We ask for minds and hearts that are open to hearing the voice of leaders who will bring us closer to your Kingdom.

We pray for discernment so that we may choose leaders who hear your Word, live your love, and keep in the ways of your truth as they follow in the steps of Jesus and his Apostles and guide us to your Kingdom of justice and peace.

We ask this in the name of your Son Jesus Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

## Family Connection Luke 20:27-38

Children in our culture often know very little about death, dying, and eternal life. Take this opportunity to talk with your children about their thoughts, beliefs, maybe even their fears, about death and dying.

In the Gospel this week, Jesus tells us that after we die, we will not need the same things we did when we were alive, but we will continue to have a relationship with God. You could use the example of a tree to help your children understand what Jesus tells us. When a tree is alive it needs water, soil, and sunlight. When the tree is used to make a table, a toy, or something else it has a new purpose. The tree no longer needs water, soil, or sunlight. Read together the short form of the Gospel, Luke 20:27, 34-38. Tell your children about your hope and faith in the resurrection of the body and eternal life with God. Pray together for those in your family who have died and conclude by praying today's Psalm.

The Effingham Knight of Columbus Council 665 has launched a Fundraising Campaign to raise funds for a new ultrasound machine for the Family Life Center in Effingham. We have been accepted into the Ultrasound Initiative Program through our Supreme Council. The Ultrasound Initiative Program began in 2009 and to date has helped fund over 1,500 new machines in all 50 states, as well as in Canada, Guatemala, Jamaica, and Peru. Through this program, if a local Council raises 50% of the cost, the Supreme Council will provide a matching grant for the other 50% to complete the funding and allow for the purchase of a new ultrasound machine. This is a tremendous opportunity to equip medically certified pro-life pregnancy centers with the modern technology that will enable expectant mothers to see and hear their babies in utero and recognize the miracle of new life within them. The business meeting will follow in Parish Center. Refreshments will be served while current pro-life issues are discussed.
- **POSITIVE NEWS!!** A ray of sunshine is streaming through on the national scene even as abortion developments in Illinois have been overwhelmingly dark in recent months (more IL abortion clinics are in the process of opening/expanding, even including mobile RV's to do abortions along our state lines). The pro-abortion site FiveThirtyEight reports that at least 10,000 fewer abortions have occurred in the US since the overturn of Roe v. Wade in June. According to this news site: "If these trends persist, there could be at least 60,000 fewer abortions in the next year as a result of the Dobbs decision."

Of course, this news site doesn't acknowledge anything positive about this. But, when I reflect on the possibility of 60,000 more baby survivors in the next year...wow! Praise God!

Thank God for the 2,700 crisis pregnancy centers throughout our country that are available to provide help at no cost for anyone who asks. Their services may be needed now more than ever.
