

Family Connection Mark 12:38-44 (shorter form, Mark 12:41-44)

Today's Gospel leads us to think about our family's financial contributions to our parish community, the diocese, other Church-sponsored organizations, and other charitable organizations. Good stewardship invites us to share our treasure as well as our time and talent. Sometimes, however, decisions about a family's charitable giving are made without our children's knowledge. Yet we teach more when we invite all family members to be aware of how we contribute to our Church and to other charitable organizations.

As you gather as a family, talk about your family's financial contributions to your parish and to other Church activities. If your family supports other charitable organizations, you might talk about these as well. Talk together about why it is important for us to share our resources with these organizations. Read today's Gospel, Mark 12:41-44. Talk about what Jesus observes about the generosity of the poor widow. Talk also about ways in which your family might also make a sacrificial gift to support your parish or other charitable organization. (Perhaps your family might choose not to go out to dinner but to contribute the money to your parish). Invite all family members to participate in the decision about what action you will take and which organization you will support with your contribution. Conclude in prayer together asking God to help your family be generous like the poor widow in today's Gospel. Pray together the Peace Prayer of St. Francis.

Fr. Al's Ramblings... I have previously spoken in regard to three things we need to do in response to the Grace of Christ in our lives: First, we must be aware of this grace. Second, say "Amen" to it and Third respond with generous hearts. We use an old-fashioned biblical term for this kind of generosity: Stewardship. Now, most people think of stewardship as what you do when the collection basket is passed to you, but when you look at it as simply about money you've reduced it to something meaningless and have robbed it of its life transforming passion.

I was speaking with a new Catholic family the other day. Both adult members they related how their lives have literally changed since becoming a Eucharistic minister and lector. They both report a renewed richness in their faith since becoming involved in ministry. They speak of being more inspired in their prayer life and have a desire to respond with generous gratitude. My friends, this testimony and response to God's call is the way of discipleship!

I have preached on stewardship, and the call to serve in response to the grace we have received in our Baptism. I have raised up the need to not simply believe in Christ but to do something for Christ. Our faith is an active faith, never passive, never simply receiving...always giving.

Please consider responding to God's grace with a generous heart. Consider giving back to God by becoming a Eucharistic Minister, Sacristan, Usher or Hospitality Minister, money counter etc. We also welcome new choir/music ministers, CCW (Council of Catholic Women), Knights of Columbus. 
