Family Connection- Luke 24:35-48 Jesus appears again to his disciples and shares a meal with them.

Family life is strengthened through storytelling and shared meal times. In a similar way, Christian life is sustained by God's word in Scripture and by Christ's presence in the Eucharist. We are especially sustained in our faith through our weekly celebration of Mass. Today's Gospel reading reminds us that the Scripture and the Eucharist are given to us so that our acts of bearing witness to Christ might be strengthened.

As you gather as a family, ask each person to share their favorite story about your family. Talk about the importance of these memories about your family life and the importance of the meals you have shared together as a family. Recall that these stories and meals strengthen the love you share. In a similar way, our Christian life is strengthened by sharing God's Word and the Eucharist at Mass. Read together today's Gospel, Luke 24:35-48. Discuss the mission that Jesus gave to his disciples after their shared meal. The Eucharist also sends us to be Christ's witnesses in the world today. Conclude by praying together that we will be strengthened by God's word and by Jesus' presence in the Eucharist to be witnesses to Christ. Pray together Tantum Ergo or today's psalm, Psalm 4.

## Fr. Al's Ramblings

This third Sunday of Easter, the messages are about hope and new life; joy and living in Jesus. Saint Peter proclaims the wonders of the Lord: The suffering Messiah has raised from the dead and been glorified. Jesus is our intercessor, and our offering for sin, our peace. But, how do we live a life of joy and hope when our own lives aren't all we want them to be? It is a fact that even the best family goes through challenging times and the happiest marriage has ups and downs. Illnesses strike those we love and watching them suffer is a terrible weight to bear. For many of us, life is full of burdens and disappointment.

Where is the Easter joy? Stop. Take a deep breath. Pause from life.

Each one of us has an invitation from Jesus to live in him, to resolve to live firmly in his presence and love. We are called to be in the care of this loving healer and friend and to carry that love with us as we live out our lives.

The first step for finding hope in this Easter season is to stop and reflect on the love that is being offered to us every second of our lives. We need to become aware of it again. When we feel overwhelmed and fearful, we can take just a few minute's break and remind ourselves that Jesus is with us, right now, in our pain.

The Easter hope is praying for the grace to be more loving and more patient. By biting my tongue and holding my judgment, I can keep the door open in my relationships; affirming that goodness is a building block in our relationships.

When Thomas saw Jesus after the resurrection, he was invited to put his fingers into the wounds of Jesus' hands and "bring your hand and put it into my side." It is a startling and graphic image, of placing our hands into a deep wound. But Jesus invites us to do that because we cannot love others until we can enter into their wounds.

That is the hope of Easter, that we can take our joy and belief and ask Jesus for healing for ourselves so that we are better able to cope with the worries we find in our everyday lives.
