

Bishop Paprocki issued the following statement in response to the U.S. Supreme Court overturning Roe v. Wade

"Today's decision by the Supreme Court of the United States marks an important moment for our nation, lifting a cloud that has hung over our country for nearly a half century. There is no way to undo the tragedy of tens of millions of innocent lives lost or the decades of division sown by the Roe v. Wade decision. But, for the sake of future generations, we can now move forward with a more honest debate and efforts to advance policies and support programs that protect innocent life and promote stability and security for vulnerable mothers. Much work remains to be done on both fronts, and that work will now necessarily have more of a local focus, particularly in our own home state of Illinois. Importantly, these efforts must include prayer and concerted efforts to preserve peace in the face of recent violence, intimidation, and criminal vandalism against churches and government officials."


#### Fr. Al'a Rambling...The "Eucharistic Revival" has begun (Corpus Christe)!

So, what is this Revival and what's the purpose? It's a national and diocesan movement to invite/welcome Catholics into a deeper understanding and devotion of the Holy Eucharist. This movement of Catholics is about healing, conversion, formation, and becoming a unified Body of Christ by focusing on encountering the real Body of Christ, present to us in the Eucharist. It's about helping people grow in understanding and devotion to the source and summit of our faith, the Holy Eucharist!

The first purpose of receiving the Eucharist is to unite each of us to God. Christ comes to us and we come to Christ. We receive Christ but at the same time Christ receives us. 'He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him' (John 6:56). This gift of himself nourishes us spiritually, so that we depend on Jesus for the life of our souls. 'Whoever eats me will live because of me' (John 6:57). This supreme gift nourishes Christians for eternal life in heaven. 'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day' (John 6:54). Our frequent, faithful Holy Communion, received worthily, helps us to grow in grace, to reflect Christ in the world, to bring him to those we meet day by day, to make us more Christ-like. We are called to become Who we receive.

The second purpose of receiving the Eucharist is to create Christian community. St Paul teaches that our receiving of the Body and Blood of Christ unites us to one another. 'Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread' (1 Corinthians 10:17). This is echoed in the Fourth Eucharistic Prayer: 'Lord, look upon this sacrifice which you have given to your Church; and by your Holy Spirit, gather all who share this one bread and one cup into the one body of Christ, a living sacrifice of praise.' Therefore, the Second Vatican Council describes the Eucharist as a supper of family fellowship and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet (Cf. The Church Today 38). The unity of the Church is celebrated and deepened in the Eucharist.
