Family Connection- Mark 14:12-16,22-26 Jesus shares his Last Supper with his disciples.

In the beginning of today’s Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples to make preparations for the Passover meal. Like most meals, the Passover meal required planning and preparation. Our celebration of the Sunday Eucharist also requires planning and preparation. Certainly the ministers at the Eucharist prepare for their roles: the person presiding prays and prepares the homily; the prayers of petition are written; the music ministers prayerfully select music and practice it before Mass; Eucharistic ministers, lectors and altar servers prepare carefully for their roles. As the worshiping assembly, we can also prepare for the Mass through our prayer during the week, by reading the Scripture before Mass, and by making ourselves present to the Eucharistic celebration.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things that are required to prepare for your family meals. Plan together a special Sunday meal by choosing the menu, preparing the shopping list, and assigning duties for cooking, setting the table, preparing decorations, leading the prayers, and cleaning. Read together today’s Gospel, Mark 14:12-16,22-26. Notice how Jesus instructed his disciples to prepare for their Passover meal. All meals require some kind of planning and preparation; so, too, our Sunday Eucharist requires planning. What might we do as a family to better prepare for our celebration of the Eucharist? Choose one or more ideas to begin to implement together as a family. Pray together that God will help your family make your celebration of the Eucharist the highlight of your week. Pray together the Lord’s Prayer.

The Annual Baby Bottle Project Sponsored by the Effingham Family Life Pregnancy Center, will begin on Mother’s Day and end on Father’s Day. Fr. Al’s Ramblings

While we continue to experience some lingering effects of, what I call, the year of COVID-19. I pray the virus will soon be just a memory as we continue heal and work toward full vaccinations for all our citizens. Like we have spoken before; we have missed our churches beautiful and sacred liturgical traditions we’ve had to place on hold. One such tradition is Corpus Christie ('Corpus Christi' is Latin for 'the body of Christ') Procession which falls between late May and the middle of June, on the first Thursday (now moved to Sunday) after Trinity Sunday (60 days after Easter). The awesome joy of walking in procession with the sacred body of Christ and the whole church following in formation. For me, some of my most cherished “church” memories from my youth are the processions of Corpus Christie as an Altar Server (then called Altar Boy). It was a much anticipated annual event that brought excitement and joy to our little church. I even remember practicing how to walk in processions!

I have researched a bit of the history of Corpus Christie and while our processions were not nearly as colorful and elaborate as some, the grace received was just as meaningful. The custom started sometime in the early part of the fourteenth century and developed into carrying the Blessed Sacrament in a wonderful procession through the town after the Mass on Corpus Christi Day. This was encouraged by the popes, some of whom granted special indulgences to all participants. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) solemnly approved and recommended the procession on Corpus Christi as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament.

During the later Middle Ages these processions developed into splendid pageants of devotion and honor to the Blessed Sacrament. They are still publicly held, and often with the ancient splendor, in Italy, France, Spain, Portugal, Austria, Belgium, Ireland, in the Catholic sections of Germany, Holland, Switzerland, Canada, Hungary, and in the Slavic countries and South America. Sovereigns and princes, presidents and ministers of the state, magistrates, members of trade and craft guilds, and honor guards of the armed forces accompany the liturgical procession while the church bells peal, bands play sacred hymns, and the faithful kneel in front of their homes to adore the Eucharistic Lord. The houses along the route of the procession are decorated with little birch trees and green boughs. Candles and pictures adorn the windows; and in many places, especially in Latin countries, the streets are covered with carpets of grass and flowers, often wrought in beautiful designs.

During his papacy, Saint Pope John Paul II led an annual Corpus Christi procession from St Peter's Square in the Vatican to the streets of Rome. We Catholics should be anxious for such processions to be promoted everywhere in the world in the light of the late Pope's example.
