

Family Connection Jesus visits the house of Martha and Mary.

In our families and homes, we have boundaries. Some are geographical; we may have our own room or part of a room that we want others to stay out of. Parents may have home offices that are off-limits to children. Some boundaries are behavioral; children may speak one way to their friends, but they are not allowed to speak the same way to their parents or other adults. A Curfew is another type of boundary, whose purpose is to protect children's safety.

Talk about examples of boundaries in your family. For the most part, these boundaries are good. Talk about how sometimes we set up boundaries for the wrong reasons. For example, if we are angry with a sibling, we may draw a line and tell him or her to stay on his or her side. Explain that when we use boundaries to exclude others, we are being hurtful. Point out how in Jesus' time, some boundaries were used to unfairly exclude people. One example was from last week's Gospel: Samaritans. This Sunday's Gospel has another example: women. Talk about how the role of women has changed in your lifetime. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus breaks down a barrier that kept women from being disciples.

Read aloud Luke 10:38-42. Talk about how Martha is conditioned by the existing boundaries of her society, but how her sister, Mary, breaks through that boundary and becomes a disciple of Jesus. Talk about how you can work as a family to break down boundaries that separate people. Point out that when we pray the Lord's Prayer, we call God "Our Father," meaning that we are all his children; no boundaries should separate us. Conclude this time together by praying the Lord's Prayer.

Fr. Al's Rambling...

This week's scripture lessons involve a general theme of "hospitality" and as a hospitable Christian people we called to go above and beyond what is normally required to extend love to one another. We as Catholic Christians should always be known that whenever we receive anyone, we receive Christ Himself.

Each of us is chosen to give witness to faith in God through our example of love for one another no matter what the circumstances may present.

Colossians 1:24-28 makes it clear that in receiving others, we often must accept the sufferings that come to us, because in that way, we fill up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ. That is truly a strong statement! Yet, if we listen carefully to Scripture, we recognize this truth: we are one in Christ Jesus: it is Christ in you, the hope for glory.

The Gospel of Luke chapter 10:38-42 brings us to the account of Jesus visiting Martha and Mary. Martha is frustrated because Mary sits and listens to Jesus while she, Martha, has to do all the work. We can wonder what would have happened had Martha simply stopped doing her work, sat down by Mary, and had listened to the Lord? That is the invitation to each of us: stop your business and be still and listen!

So, reflect on the prescribed readings for this weekend and step into the incredibly wonderful ways in which God is present in our normal daily life. God comes as stranger, God comes as Guest, God comes in suffering and God comes in being still and listening. Let us be hospitable to our fellow man!

Who We Are:

The Apostles of Divine Charity is a male Religious Association founded and headquartered in the Diocese of Obala, Cameroon (Central Africa), with the consent of the Most Rev. Sosthene Leopold Bayemi Matjei, Bishop of Obala Diocese. The Apostles of Divine Charity was founded exclusively to help the poor and serve their needs. Our mission is primarily centered in our profound concern for the poor and the needy, especially those who are given less or zero attention in their communities. Our mission is to help this class of people reinstate their sense of value and help them become more cognizant of their relevance to human society, to themselves, their families, and to God. Our intention is to offer counseling to them, understand their needs, provide education to them, and discern the best ways of helping them become better persons, for the sake of God's Kingdom. Making visible and practical the Mercy and the Love of God through the Works of Charity and by the means of the Corporal Works of Mercy is the major ingredient of our mission. Our utmost desire is to be the mouthpiece of God and "another Christ" to the poor and the needy. We are thus far limited to working in Cameroon. However, some of our seminarians do their studies in Nigeria.

Specific Means of Fulfilling our Mission:

- 1. Education: Providing education to children and youth who have interest to go to school but have no one to support them. We also offer adult education to interested adults who did not have the opportunity to receive formal education when they were younger due to poverty and lack of money.
- 2. Healthcare Provision: Providing health care services to the people of God is also an integral means of fulfilling our Charitan mission.
- 3. Youth Apostolate: We are also into active youth apostolate aimed at providing moral and religious education to the youth.
- 4. Orphanage Ministry: Ministering to the orphans and the vulnerable children occupies a very important place in our charism. We have orphanage centers where we provide shelter, food, clothing, and sound education to the homeless, orphans and indigent children.
- 5. Caring for Retired Priests/Religious and Elderly People: We also extend our apostolate to priests and religious who are retired or inactive due to their health conditions or other reasons, and elderly people whose family members are not able to care for them.
- 6. Home Visitations: Through our house-to-house visitation apostolate, we are exposed to the needs of the community that we serve. By having healthy interactions with the people, we stand a better chance of getting to know them and the pastoral needs they have.
- 7. Parish Work: We are also open to running as many parishes as assigned to us by the local ordinary. At our parishes, we strive to be priests and servants to the people of God. In other words, the spiritual and the pastoral needs of the parishioners are our topmost priority.
