

Family Connection - Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23

Children have learned the importance of following rules. Like the Pharisees in today's Gospel, they often bring to our attention the infractions of others. Even parents sometimes get caught off guard by their children's observations: "Why don't you have to go to bed at 8:00?" or "But I saw you eat a cupcake before breakfast once." Our rules for our children are not arbitrary. We establish and enforce family rules with the intention of helping our children grow to be healthy and mature adults. We foster this maturity when we also initiate conversations with our children about the purposes behind family rules and teach them the essential values that rules help us observe.

As you gather as a family, list some of your most important family rules. Together, try to write a single, positive statement that captures the essential value behind your family rules. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus criticize the Pharisees for making their rules about ritual purity equal to the commandments of God's Law. Read today's Gospel, Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23. When we remember the essential element behind our rules, we see that our rules help us be the good people that Jesus wants us to be. Conclude in prayer together that we may always honor God's Law in our words and deeds. Pray together today's psalm, Psalm 15.

Fr. Al's Ramblings

As I promised, this third and final article on the subject of Indulgences is written to bring to light a little-known indulgence or perhaps, better stated, a lesser utilized one. It is the Apostolic Pardon and it's an indulgence given for the remission of temporal punishment due to sin. The Apostolic Pardon is given by a priest, usually along with Viaticum (the Last Sacrament) and generally at the time of death. It is not usually given as part of the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. The Apostolic Pardon does not forgive sins by the act of absolution; it deals only with the punishment (purgation) due for those sins that have already been sacramentally forgiven. In other words, just as Jesus promised the Good Thief on Good Friday he would be with him in paradise "this day," properly disposed Catholics who receive the Apostolic Pardon will enter heaven. It is for this reason that it is reserved for the time of death; the soul must be free from serious (mortal) sin.

The sacrament of the sick (Anointing) should be administered right away when a person is in danger of death, rather than waiting for the last moment. There have been many beautiful experiences reported upon receipt of the anointing on the forehead and hands as the person is prepared to pass from this world to the next, but it can also provide physical healing. "It is one of those sacraments more people should be asking for." "We mustn't forget the Church's teaching that reparation for sin always goes along with the absolution we receive from the priest. The apostolic pardon is the means by which the Church's treasury of merit can be applied to us in our last hour, when we don't have much time on this side of eternity to make the reparation required. For the sake of peace for their loved ones' souls, family members should ask for this grace from Holy Mother Church, in the unlikely event that the priest administering the last rites doesn't offer it."

Silver Rose Ceremony - The Knights of Columbus will be hosting a Silver Rose Prayer Service at 6:30 P.M. in the Council Chamber at the Effingham Event Center on Wednesday September 15th. The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when a live rose, blessed by a bishop in Ontario traveled to New York, then to Texas and on to Mexico where it ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Silver Rose Program is now a journey of nine Silver Roses beginning each year in March and ending on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Each Silver Rose travels a unique route throughout North America beginning in Canada and ending in Mexico, except one ends in Washington, D.C., and another ends at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT, where the Knights of Columbus was founded.

The Effingham Knights of Columbus was unable to schedule the actual Rose that will be in the area as another Council had already spoken for the date we preferred.
