

Conclude in prayer together asking God to increase our faith in Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. Pray together the Act of Faith.



Fr. Al's Ramblings

In response to a few recent inquiries concerning the subject of indulgences. I think all the recent protests and violence has heightened the awareness of the forgiveness of sins through the mercy of God that indulgences are making a welcome reappearance in the spiritual life of Catholics. After centuries of decline in their use and almost a complete neglect after the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), the power of indulgences to enliven a sense of charity and to sharpen a healthy sorrow for sin is finally being rediscovered. Further, I believe Pope Francis' proclamation twenty twenty-one the year of St. Joseph which has increased an awareness, or awaking, to the power of indulgences.

Many of we more senior Catholics probably recall a time when indulgences were probably over emphasized. Today, it's surely true that they're under-emphasized. Many Catholics don't know what indulgences are, and they're at a loss to explain the Church's position on indulgences when asked.


The reference to turn to is the Enchiridion of Indulgences. "Enchiridion" means "handbook," and the Enchiridion of Indulgences is the Church's official handbook, revised January 1, 1967, on what acts and prayers carry indulgences and what indulgences actually are. An indulgence is defined as "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due for sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned." The first thing to note is that forgiveness of a sin is separate from punishment for the sin. Through sacramental confession we obtain forgiveness, but we aren't off the hook as far as punishment goes.

Indulgences are two kinds: partial and plenary. A partial indulgence removes part of the temporal punishment due for sins. A plenary indulgence removes all of it. This punishment may come either in this life, in the form of various sufferings, or in the next life, in purgatory. What we don't get rid of here we suffer there. Having said all this, it is not as easy as just saying prayers and performing acts, indeed the most important first step is a good confession. It's being free from all attachment to sin and it's quite possible that even good people, who seek plenary indulgences regularly, never, in their whole lives, obtain one, because they are unwilling to relinquish their favorite little sins.

Friends, this is just the tip of the iceberg! I suggest you read the Catechism of the Catholic Church definition of Indulgences (1471) as a starting point. I will post a few more ramblings on indulgences in upcoming bulletin editions, so, stay tuned for more!
