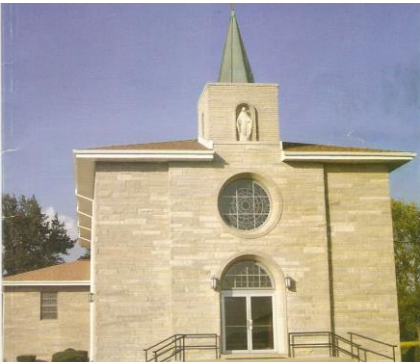

Suffering Servant-Isaiah 53:10-11 describes a servant who suffers for others. This servant takes on pain and sorrow to bring healing and forgiveness. This passage points to Jesus, who willingly suffered to save us from our sins. Jesus's suffering was not in vain. By His wounds, we are healed. His sacrifice shows the depth of His love for us and calls us to love others in the same way. We are called to bear one another's burdens and share in their suffering. In our lives, we will face challenges and suffering. Following Jesus's example, we should embrace these moments as opportunities to grow in love and service. By doing so, we reflect the love of Christ to those around us.

Christ's Priesthood-Hebrews 4:14-16 speaks of Jesus as our high priest. He understands our weaknesses because He faced the same temptations. Because of this, we can approach God with confidence, knowing we will receive mercy. Jesus is not distant or unapproachable. He knows what it is like to be human. He sympathizes with our struggles and is always ready to help us. We are encouraged to draw near to God in prayer. Trusting in Jesus's understanding and mercy, we can find strength and grace in our times of need. Jesus, our high priest, bridges the gap between us and God.

True Greatness in Service-In Mark 10:35-45, James and John ask Jesus for positions of honor. Jesus teaches them that true greatness comes from serving others. He came not to be served but to serve and give His life for many. Jesus's response turns worldly ideas of power and authority upside down. True leadership in the Kingdom of God is about humility and service, not seeking honor for oneself. He calls us to follow His example. This lesson challenges us to examine our desires and ambitions. Are we seeking personal glory, or are we willing to serve others selflessly? True greatness is found in humility and service, as shown by Jesus. Reflecting on these readings reminds us of our call to serve others humbly. Jesus's example of suffering, priesthood, and service guides us in our journey of faith. May we embrace these lessons and strive to follow Him more closely each day.

Reflection Questions for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

- How can we embrace suffering in our lives as an opportunity to grow in love and service?
- In what ways can we bear one another's burdens?
- How does Jesus's understanding of our weaknesses encourage us to draw near to God?
- How can we trust in Jesus's mercy during our times of need?
- What are our true motivations behind seeking positions of authority or honor?
- How can we practice humility in our daily lives?
- In what ways can we serve others selflessly, following Jesus's example?
- How do our ambitions align with Jesus's teaching on true greatness?
- What steps can we take to deepen our prayer life and trust in God's mercy?
- How can we reflect Jesus's love to those around us?

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

From October 3rd-7th, I was at a campgrounds (sleeping in bunks in cabins) outside Oak Park, IL at Camp Sullivan. A few times a year, I try together with friends from across the US (and sometimes Europe) to have a long weekend to share meals, enjoy one another's company, and just relax with one another. The locations we go to vary, and the last time it was even in the state, was 20 years ago, so I was glad not to have to drive a longer distance or deal with airports this fall. Also, it was convenient because the retreat that I went on, immediately after, was at Benet Lake, Wisconsin, at the Benedictine Abbey, which was only about an hour and twenty minutes from Camp Sullivan, so that worked out well.

Why do I tell you all this? Well, it's a reminder that friendships with other people are important, and while communicating online or via phone is good, being in the presence of others, in a community plays a part in development and enrichment in all our lives. We were created to be in community, to relate to one another. While alone time is certainly important and necessary as well, the family and friends that we form can (and hopefully do) help us to be better and more holy people. Both St. Mary in Shumway and St. Mary in Green Creek are communities, and as pastor of both, I hope, in whatever way I can, to help these parish communities continue to grow and develop. Of course, both parishes existed long before me, and I pray that they will continue to exist after me, as they do for each and every person within the communities. But while they have existed before each and every one of us and hopefully will after, we all have a role to play in the development and flourishing of the parishes.

For my part, I will certainly be praying for each and every member of the parishes; but my role is not solely to pray for you. I desire to be involved in everyone's lives to the extent that I can be, whether it's going to your homes, going to community functions, going to the school sporting events, to any number of things. I know that I won't be able to make it to each and every invitation, but I want to be able to make it to as many as I can. The more, as a whole, we intentionally foster these communities and these friendships, the more likely our parish communities, both inside the physical churches, and outside, can grow and multiply and be even more effective missionary disciples. So, I ask your prayers for myself, and I pray that during all of our time here, that our parishes foster vitality and community and missionary discipleship.
