

Thoughts from Father...

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, it is with a grateful heart that I am writing this message for you. Partially because I'm on vacation with some friends this weekend (planned several months ago) and will be on retreat this next week, but largely to have become the pastor of these two parishes.

Prior to this year, I didn't have a great devotion to St. Thèrése of Lisieux; while I recognized that she was holy and, of course, deserving of being a saint, due to her holiness, I just did not really connect with her, even though I know many seminarians, priests and bishops did and do. I didn't connect with her writing or the "Little Way" that she popularized. And, yet, when I was asked to become the pastor of these parishes in Shumway and Green Creek, and that the effective date would be October 1st, I decided that I would start the novena in her honor, asking for her intercession. And, at the same time, I decided that I would give her diary, commonly known as "The Story of a Soul" another try. I had successfully read it once, and as I said, did not connect with it; I didn't have terribly high hopes, but I thought that it was worth a shot. So, I've been listening to the audiobook. And this year, this time, I really connected, I really just found that St. Thérèse and her writings just made sense.

So, why do I share this with you? There are some prayers, some writings, some saints that we may not connect with during one part of our life that we may connect with later in our lives. And that's okay, as we grow and develop, deepen our understanding and prayer life and love, we can gain a deeper appreciation for the saints and their lives. The spiritual life, including our relationships with the saints, is not finished at our graduations, promotions, or retirements. While we may reach plateaus, or go down into valleys, at times, there is always another hill to climb. That is not meant to be discouraging, rather, it's like seeking the next part of an adventure, there's excitement. And we know that we are not alone in this journey. Jesus always accompanies us, we have the intercession of the saints, and we have the support of one another, the Church on earth. Let us not give in to despair and discouragement in our pilgrimage here on earth, but instead, rejoice knowing our goal and rejoice in the fact that we are not in this journey alone.

We can let go of our fears and trust that God will take care of us. This childlike trust helps us to live more fully and freely in God's love.
