

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

Sometimes, when we pray, we have difficulty coming up with the words to say. And, so, we go back to the memorized prayers to say what we need or ask. And the traditional prayers are very good and very beautiful. But, in that struggle, it's a good time to reflect how much alike we are to Jesus' disciples, in Luke 11:1-4, one of the disciples asks, "Lord, teach us to pray." The disciples had possibly heard some of the ritual prayers prayed by the priests in the Temple; some had probably heard Gentiles praying in their rituals; and the disciples wanted to fit in, impress others, and really wanted to know what to say in prayer in general. And, so, Jesus did teach His disciples how to pray, by teaching them the Our Father.

That sounds very familiar to me. Growing up, we went to church every Sunday, Holy Day of Obligation, and occasionally to a daily Mass, so I heard the prayers of the liturgy. Although, I think a greater portion I didn't know what they meant and certainly couldn't pray them by myself. And in junior high and high school, I saw and heard my non-Catholic friends praying, and I was impressed, and a bit envious.

But the Lord did and does teach us how to pray. He gave us the Our Father, and that really is the model for our prayer: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication. We recognize the goodness of God, we know we fall short, we give thanks for the mercy and love He pours out upon us, and we ask what we need: ACTS.

The Lord also teaches us how to pray when He takes Peter, James, and John with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane. He asks them to stay alert, to keep watch, to be vigilant. Sometimes, our prayer is simply being present and silent with the Lord. And, certainly, that can be difficult. The apostles fell asleep, we too, can fall asleep. We also, at times, feel like the silence needs to be filled. Sometimes, we can be distracted. Those are definitely temptations that we can and do experience. If we don't attempt, if we don't stretch those "muscles", then we will continue to stay at the stage of being envious and desiring that the Lord teach us an easy way to pray.

We are not alone, we can assist one another in prayer. We can encourage one another to pray before a meeting or an event, especially as a family., The more we do so, the more we will be confident in God's grace and love to do what we need and to communicate His grace and love to all whom we encounter.
