Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

Hopefully the snow provided more of a sense of joy than it did a sense of dread. But, given the amount of snow and the roads being dicey, I'm sure it caused a lot of complications.

As we continue through the Mass, and get to the Penitential Act, we may ask why we follow the greeting with acknowledging our sins and calling them to mind. Well, we do so while keeping in mind what we have come here to do: to celebrate the Eucharist. To participate in the saving act of Jesus Christ. We acknowledge that there is a reason that Jesus Christ gave Himself for us. We are not like the Pharisee, in Luke 18, who stands apart from the tax collector and says, "Thank God that I am not like other people." Instead, we are to be like the tax collector, who stands with the rest of the people, and gives thanks for the mercy of God. We come together, in the Mass, giving thanks that even though we have sinned God pours out His love and mercy upon us. We are not saying "How wretched am I", but "How great is your mercy, Oh Lord." We acknowledge that we do not deserve God's mercy and acknowledge His loving kindness.

Then comes the Gloria, in which we give praise to both the Father and the Son. In the first part of the Gloria, we are addressing the Father, while in the second part, we are addressing the Son. Of course, we end by invoking the Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But where does the Gloria come from? The first time we really hear, "Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests" is in Luke 2:13, when the angels are proclaiming to the Shepherds that Jesus has been born. Because of this, It is known as the Angelic Hymn.

The Introductory Rites conclude with the Opening Prayer, or as it is officially known, the Collect. The words, "Let us pray" are followed by a bit of silence before the priest prays. The silence is important because, as we are aware that we are in the presence of God, we now call to mind the intentions we bring with us to Mass. Gathering all that together, the priest directs the community's petitions to God in one single prayer. The word "collect" comes from the Latin collecta, meaning "the gathering of people together. The structure of a Collect has 5 distinct parts: 1. invocation or address of God; 2. acknowledgment or description of God; 3. petition or request; 4. aspiration or desired result; and 5. conclusion or doxology. So, as we gather our prayers, and the collect is prayed, let us also reflect on what the prayer is leading us toward through the Mass.
