

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

While I enjoyed the Doctor Who Convention, and spending time with friends, I'm also glad to be back.

We enter as the priest says, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." This illustrates that the work of the Mass, the Liturgy, is not the work of the priest alone. Not only do the people offer what is collected, they offer themselves as well. It is important that they are full and active participants in the liturgy. They are to join themselves to the priests. And we recall that God is not asking for offerings of grain or goats or cattle, but He desires that we bring to Him our hearts, so that we may be merciful and loving to one another. When our sacrifice is one of openness to the Lord and His will, He is sure to accept our sacrifice.

And, of course, the people rise and reply, "May the Lord accept the Sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name for our good and the good of all His holy Church." The people are affirming that the priest is leading them in worship and sacrifice. We also notice that the people do not say that it is for the praise and glory of the priest, rather it is for the praise and glory of the name of God. The parish, and each and every individual Mass, is not meant to be a cult of personality for any particular priest, bishop, or pope. The sacrifice is meant to give glory to God. And the sacrifice is for the good, not just of an individual parish, but for the good of the entirety of the Church. The more a parish seeks to do the will of God, the better off the universal Church will be. We certainly want to have our parish have vitality, but it is not for our own sake and to say, "Look how great we are." Instead, we are to look to the glory of God above all things and to look to work for the betterment and vitality of the parish, of the Diocese, and of the Universal Church.
