Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are al-

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

As we continue through the walkthrough of the Mass, we come to the Prayer over the Offerings. This is similar to what we see at the beginning of the Mass, for the Collect. The Prayer over the Offerings gives us a summary of what we are offering and points our minds and hearts to the Eucharistic Prayer that is to come. We are asking God to accept the gifts we bring. And, so, we are reminded that, while we come together as a community, we bring our own gifts as individuals. In Sacrosanctum Concilium, one of the documents from the Second Vatican Council, we hear the importance of the "full and active participation by all the people" (Paragraph 14). Part of that participation is acknowledging that we have come before the Lord, offering our gifts and praying that they may be made worthy. Not only do we pray that our gifts are made worthy, we also pray that we may be united to Jesus Christ in His sacrifice. So, the Prayer over the Offerings leads us to a greater desire to be united to Christ, and a deeper desire that God's will be done in our own lives. The Mass is not a matter of us seeking entertainment, it's a matter of us worshiping God, and the Prayer Over the Offerings reminds us of that.

We then arrive at the Preface, of which there is a variety. However, all the Prefaces give particular reasons for praising God at the Mass, depending on which Liturgical Season we are in or depending on the particular feast or solemnity that is being celebrated that day. There are four parts of the Preface, the first being the initial dialogue, "The Lord be with you", etc. This bonds or pairs the prayer of the people with the prayer of the priest and lifts our hearts to Christ. The second part, "It is right to give Him thanks and praise...", elevates our prayer to the Father, fulfilling the command of Christ to pray to the Father (Luke 11:2). Then we have the third part, which is the most variable, depending on the days or liturgical seasons, which proclaims with joy the fundamental reasons for the act of thanksgiving, which always revolves around creation and salvation. The fourth part is the end of the Preface and a prologue to the Holy, Holy, Holy, which associates the prayer of the Church on earth with the worship of the heavenly liturgy.
