Lenten Regulations

1. ABSTINENCE – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

 FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

It's been a beautiful week in the area for the most part, so I hope that everyone was able to enjoy whatever part of it that they could. We come back to the walkthrough of the Mass at the bulk of the Eucharistic Prayer, of which there are several parts.

The epiclesis, the calling down of the Holy Spirit and asking that through the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become Christ's Body and Blood, and that those who partake in Communion may be drawn deeper into encounter with Jesus Christ through the reception of God's grace.

The Institution narrative and Consecration: the priest speaks the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, and Jesus Christ, Almighty God, Second Person of the Trinity, through the hands and voice of the priest, is now truly, really, and substantially present on the altar!

The Memorial Acclamation: by which the Church, fulfilling the command that she received from Christ the Lord through the Apostles, celebrates the memorial of Christ, recalling especially his blessed Passion, glorious Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven. And for the Church, in this understanding of "memorial", we are there, present with Christ. It's not just something that we are thinking about and reflecting on with joy or sadness. We believe, as Catholics, that we are present, even if our senses do not recognize it.

The Offering: We are reminded again that we are not mere spectators in the Mass, we are participants. We're participating in the Sacrifice of Christ, but we're also offering ourselves to God. We offer all that we are and all that we have to give, both to God and to others. We participate in the life of Jesus, and we are called to live out that participation every day.

The Intercessions: these help us understand that our individual parish is not in Catholicism by itself. We mention the shepherd of our Diocese, Bishop Paprocki, and the shepherd of the Church, Pope Francis, and all the clergy. We pray for them that they may be guided by the wisdom of God, that they will lead the church ever closer to God. We also pray for the faithful departed, that they may know the mercy of God and rest in Him. And then we ask for the intercession of the Saints, asking the help of those who are already in the presence of God.

The doxology, which is a prayer that "gives praise and glory to God, often in a special way to the three divine persons of the Trinity" (Catechism, 875). Through Jesus we have access to God; with Jesus we are children of God, through the adoption merited for us; in Jesus: we have one and the same life; in the unity of the Holy Spirit we are brought together as the Church.

The Amen: a Hebrew word meaning "truly" or "let it be done". It is asserting that what the priest has prayed is affirmed and celebrated. That we are participating in the Mass. We rejoice that God loves us and we love God and one another, and we pray that we may live that reality out more each and every day.
