Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are al-

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

As we end the Eucharistic Prayer with the Great Amen, seen by many theologians as the most important communal Amen of the Mass, we then enter the Communion Rite. But, just before we get to the Communion Rite, it may be helpful to go into why people consider the Great Amen the most important. The bread and wine have been changed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus is truly present with us; This is the moment of Jesus being offered to the Father in perfect praise, and we have been invited to join with Jesus. How wondrous and miraculous is this! Hopefully we are so excited at what is happening that we want to sing and shout out with great praise and exultation this Amen, a word that means "Yes", "I assent", and "so be it!"

And, so, we come fully to the Communion Rite, which starts with the priest saying "At the Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say." The Lord's Prayer is the prayer that Jesus taught His disciples, when they asked Him to teach them how to pray. This is a prayer that has been kept and continued to have been prayed during Mass, in the Rosary, and is the model even for spontaneous prayer. We are affirming, that Jesus is not only fully human, but also fully divine, and that He is our Savior. We also know, that it is through the invitation of Jesus that we call the Father, Our Father. Through our Baptism we've been adopted into the family of God and so have the ability to call Jesus Christ our Brother, and the Father our Father.

We then move to the Lord's Prayer itself, again, the model for our prayer lives. We acknowledge that God is Our Father, that without Him, we would not exist. We profess that God is in Heaven, that He is not restricted to one region here on Earth. He is above all things, and yet we can see His creative spirit in everything beautiful. We say that His Name is Hallowed, is holy. We pray that His Kingdom will come, that it will be made manifest, and that His will be done, not just in Heaven, but also on Earth. We ask that we may submit to His will throughout our lives. We pray that we may receive and be grateful for the food that we partake in, not just the food that feeds our stomachs, but also the food that sustains our souls. And we pray that our sins may be forgiven, just as we forgive the sins of others. We are called to extend mercy and forgiveness to those that have trespassed against us, just as God extends His mercy and forgiveness to us who have sinned against Him. We pray that we may not be tempted, but even if we are, that we may be delivered from every evil.
