

Thoughts from Fr. Adam...

Happy Mother's Day! I know that this day can be difficult for those who have lost their Mothers, or their children; I also know that there are sometimes obstacles to relationships between Mothers and their children, and they may be difficult to overcome. Whatever our difficulties, whatever our struggles though, whether familial or otherwise, I encourage each one of us to go to the Blessed Virgin Mary, that she may intercede for us and show us her concern for us.

As we continue through the Mass, we come to the Communion Procession. Now, some people, unfortunately, may compare processing up for Communion to waiting in line at the grocery store or at the DMV. However, what we are doing is so much greater than that; we are processing up, each of us, together, in pilgrimage, to receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We are receiving the very Bread from Heaven Himself. As we read on the website of the United States Council of Catholic Bishops, "each time we move forward together to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord, we join the countless ranks of all the baptized who have gone before us, our loved ones, the canonized and uncanonized saints down through the ages, who at their time in history formed a part of this mighty stream of believers." So, each time we participate in processing up to receive the Eucharist, we are participating in something more than ourselves and much, much more than an individual errand. We are united with the Body of Christ. This is not something that we should ever take for granted, and so is one of the many reasons we are called to be properly disposed and prepared to receive Holy Communion.

As we have received Communion, in some parishes the purification of vessels happens, although in other parishes it occurs after Mass. Both are viable options. Typically, it is the responsibility of the priest or deacon (if there is a deacon present at Mass) to purify the vessels. The one purifying the vessels is to ensure that any particles of the Hosts are collected into the chalice that they may be consumed. This is not just some fussy minutiae that it may appear to be at first. As we believe in the real presence in the smallest particle of the Host or in even a drop of the precious Blood, this period of purification ensures the proper reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. And as purification of Sacred Vessels happens, if the priest does so, he prays, "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity." The more we acknowledge that the Eucharist is a gift, and the more we pray and desire that that we may receive Jesus with a clean heart, the more and more we welcome the healing of our hearts and our spirits.
