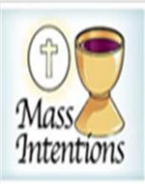
Thanksgiving Day Mass at Shumway will be at 7:30am.

As we come to the end of the Liturgical year, in our readings we hear about the destruction of the Temple, which occurred in 70 A.D. We also hear about the judgement that each of us will face, at our death, or at the Second Coming of Jesus. The events that led up to the destruction of the Temple, many people would find frightening: wars, pestilence, famine, earthquakes, and plagues. And then to think about being brought before civil authorities or the religious authorities, being betrayed by family members or friends? Being put to death because they thought the person’s faith in Jesus was a danger to society, or the Jewish faith? Those aren’t particularly easy warnings to process.

And then, for us to know that we will face our individual judgment and the Universal Judgment, that Jesus knows what we do, that nothing is hidden from Him. On the surface, that can, at the very least, make us nervous as well. We know Jesus is merciful, we know He is loving, but sometimes we may be afraid of His justice, or be concerned that He is a harsh and unforgiving judge. And, yet, the opening line of Absolution in the Sacrament of Penance is: “God the Father of mercies”. The Lord knows our hearts, He knows if we desire, if we do our best, relying on His grace, to live in right relationship with him, with our neighbor. And do we sometimes fall, and fail and sin? Yes, but that’s why He gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation, that we may be start anew. He desires that we trust in Him, to know His mercy and love for us, and to live in Him. Are we called to greater than just thinking about ourselves and our comfort and getting ahead in the world? Absolutely. And we are also aware that the Lord isn’t cruel and He doesn’t relish every instance that we fail to His will because of a twisted desire make us suffer at our judgment. Instead, He looks upon us with compassion, and as many times as we seek out His mercy, as many times He extends it to us.

While the news of the future destruction of the Temple and what would lead up to it could be frightening news for those heard, and the knowledge of our judgment can scare us at times, the remedy is the same: Trust in the Lord. Rest in Him. Whatever may come, whatever we may face, let us place our trust in Him, and let Him take care of all of our anxieties.

Dear Padre November 23, 2025
Why is a US secular holiday like Thanksgiving on the Church’s liturgical calendar?
Since November 1969, the Proper Calendar offers a Thanksgiving Day Mass for US dioceses. While it also includes Independence Day, no suggestion is made for other civic holidays (Memorial Day, Labor Day, etc.). Instead, the Roman Missal provides “Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions” that are suited to these observances (Ordo #5, GIRM 368–378).

In the United States, November is associated with giving thanks to God. In 1623—three years after the Pilgrims sailed to this land on the Mayflower—a severe drought threatened their crops. Consequently, a day of prayer was observed, an abundant rain saved the harvest, and a Day of Thanksgiving was established. In 1863, President Lincoln issued a proclamation for “Thanksgiving and Praise to Our Beneficent Father” on the last Thursday of November (later moved to the fourth Thursday).
However, thanking God isn’t just a one-day event; it’s meant to be a perennial practice. Recall the lesson of the ten lepers healed by Jesus, only one of whom returned to thank him. (See Luke 17:11–19.) People who don’t take their blessings for granted return thanks to God in prayer. Therefore, offer brief prayers of gratitude to God throughout the day, every day, for such gifts as your health and faith, the freedoms allowed in this country, “thy daily bread,” and the Eucharist—a word that means “thanksgiving.” “Become what you pray”—a grateful disciple of our Lord! ●Fr. St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions--Vietnamese Martyrs Feast Day: November 24

St. Andrew Dung-Lac and his companions are known as the Vietnamese Martyrs. They were Christians who lived in Vietnam and gave their lives for their faith. During the 18th and 19th centuries, Christians in Vietnam faced persecution. Many were arrested, tortured, and killed for refusing to give up their beliefs.

St. Andrew Dung-Lac was a priest. He was born to a poor family in Vietnam. As a young man, he learned about the Catholic faith and was baptized. He became a priest and worked to spread the Gospel in Vietnam, even though it was very dangerous.

The Vietnamese Martyrs include over 100 other priests, laypeople, and religious brothers and sisters. They all stood firm in their faith, even when faced with torture and death. They wanted to remain loyal to Jesus Christ, no matter the cost.
