As we begin the season of Advent, it can be easy to focus on the hopeful anticipation as we prepare for the celebration of Christmas. On the other hand, if I only focus on the hopeful anticipation of the celebration of the birth of Our Savior into the world to the exclusion of how I can make a home fitting for Christ in my life and in my home, then I don't understand the entirety of what I am supposed to be doing for Advent. Is Jesus welcome in my life?

If Jesus is welcome in my life, am I living in a manner that openly acknowledges it? Or, am I saying to Jesus, "Yeah, you're free to stay, I want you here, but if you can make sure that you're not seen when you're coming or going, that'd be great. Oh, and if you could stay in your guest room while my friends and family are over, that'd be best. I mean, I like you and everything, and want you here, but...I don't know if they would appreciate you being here. It's not that I don't want others to know that you're a part of my life, I just don't know that they're ready to be in this group, and I don't know that you'd be comfortable, so it's just for the best that we keep this whole thing private." If I treat Jesus like that, then I really don't actually want Him to part of my life, I just want Him around when it's convenient for me and I won't think that I'll be embarrassed or ashamed.

But Advent isn't meant to just be a season that we celebrate in Church, but pay no attention to outside, even though many stores have had Christmas decorations out and prominent since around Halloween. We can live out the season of Advent in our lives, and it's a good thing to do. What do I need to prepare the way of the Lord, both in church and in my life? If I know that Jesus wants to be at home in my life because of His deep and abiding love for me, what am I doing to make sure that my soul, that my heart that my entire life is prepared to receive Him each and every day?

That doesn't mean that we can't have fun, that we have to be serious and severe every moment of every day. After all we preparing, we are making the way ready for the Lord with JOYFUL anticipation. We rejoice in His mercy, we rejoice in His love, we rejoice that He desires to be in our midst. And, so, while we prepare ourselves, in a special way during Advent, we don't need to be riddled with anxiety or fear, or say "I'm not sure Jesus is going to be happy with what I've let my life become overcrowded with. If we work on preparing to welcome Him into our lives, He will help us get rid of the things that have led us away from Him. So, while it is important for us to prepare, let us not fear while we are doing so.

Is Advent a penitential season?

Strictly speaking, the penitential times in the Church are "every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent" (Code of Canon Law, 1250). Advent is a time to prepare for Christmas when Christ's First Coming is remembered, and this remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. (See Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the General Roman Calendar, 39.) While Advent is more anticipatory than penitential, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops states, "Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas." Although, historically, Advent was similar to Lent as a forty-day period of prayer and fasting, it was less severe than the season preceding Easter, and it lacked uniformity in the Western Church. The Eastern Church still begins the Nativity Fast on November 15, while in the Western Church, Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas.

Regardless, the significant focus of Advent is our Lord's coming (adventus in Latin). The Church reflects this anticipation of Advent through such practices as limiting floral arrangements in the sanctuary, simpler liturgical music, and omitting the Gloria at Mass until Christmas. We can also reflect the anticipation of Advent through such spiritual practices as participation in works of charity, moderation in shopping, celebration of the sacrament of penance, fasting on Fridays, and prayerful contemplation on our Savior's Incarnation. ●Fr. 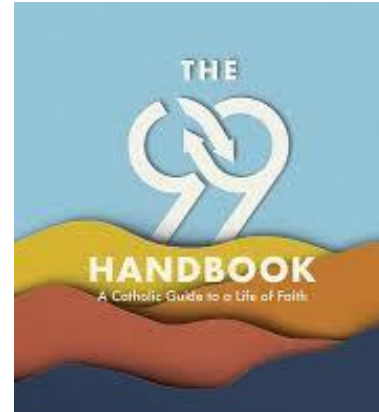
