The last few weeks, we've had two funerals in the Diocese for two priests who were still in active ministry, Fr. Joe Ring and Fr. Daren Zehnle. Two men, two brother priests of mine who have died suddenly, and truly, surprisingly.

Unfortunately, I wasn't able to make it to Fr. Joe's funeral a few weeks ago. However, I did make it to Fr. Daren's on Tuesday. And certainly, it was beautiful to see Fr. Daren's friends, family members, former parishioners, and current students fill St. Francis church in Quincy. It was beautiful because it was a testimony to those whom he had impacted throughout his life, throughout his ministry. And those who were able to attend, wanted to demonstrate, in a particular way, the fact that he made an impact on them, and they love him for it.

Another beautiful aspect of going to a brother priest's funeral, and concelebrating, is the fact that, at least in the Diocese of Springfield, we all try to make it to every one that we are able. It isn't always possible to do, unfortunately, but we are all going to make a genuine effort to do so. We may not have always seen eye to eye with the priest who has died; we may not have been the closest of friends, after all, we have different personalities, different interests, different opinions and viewpoints; we may have only seen one another at the "official" Diocesan events. And, yet, even when any or all of those things are true, and then some, he is still a brother priest, truly a brother; and even when I don't necessarily get along with family members or agree with everything that they do, I still love my family members, whether it's by blood, whether it's brothers in the priesthood, or whether it's my parish families. And I want the best for all of my family, I want my family to know I love them, and more, most importantly, God loves them and calls them to Himself. And I pray for all my family members, living, and pray for the repose of their souls when they die. The family of God, is the best family to be a part of. And to be within the particular brotherhood of priests within the family of God, is an absolute gift.

Please, pray for the priests that you know, that daily we can grow in witnessing to the love of Jesus to everyone we encounter, that we may rely on the grace and the mercy of God in our own lives, knowing that it is in Him, that we, that all people, truly, find their identity and their home. Priests, especially me, are not perfect, we have our flaws and our foibles, and we make mistakes. The prayers of our parishioners, of our families, of our friends, are truly important. They help to sustain us, help us to grow, and are a true witness to love.

Dear Padre December 14, 2025

Does the Bible say that Mary was in her sixth month of pregnancy at the Annunciation?

The announcement of Jesus' birth in Luke begins, "In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph...and the virgin's name was Mary" (Luke 1:26-27). This Scripture passage taken out of context could possibly give the impression that "in the sixth month" refers to Mary. However, it refers to Mary's cousin Elizabeth, who was in the sixth month of her pregnancy with John the Baptist. The proper context is a few verses before this one that reads, "Elizabeth conceived, and she went into seclusion for five months" (Luke 1:24).

Regarding Mary's pregnancy, at the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel tells her, "Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus.... The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God" (Luke 1:31, 35). Gabriel also informs Mary, "And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren" (Luke 1:36). In general, women already in their sixth month of pregnancy would likely be aware of their condition, and it would not be easy to conceal from others. ●
