The Gift of Living Bread

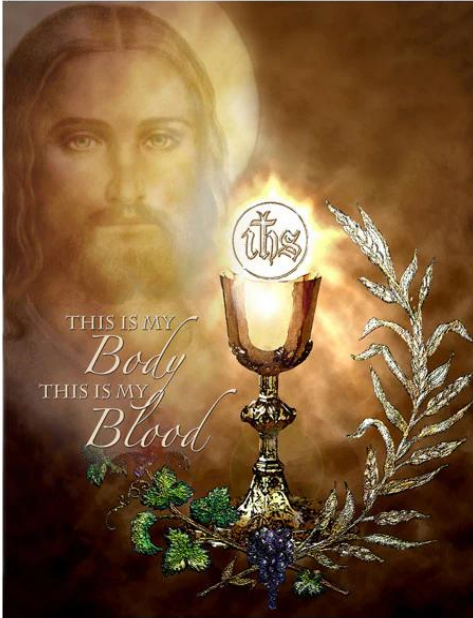

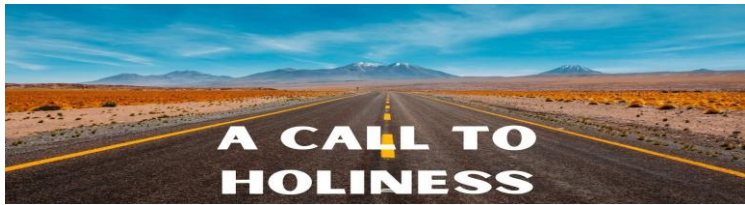

Action Step:

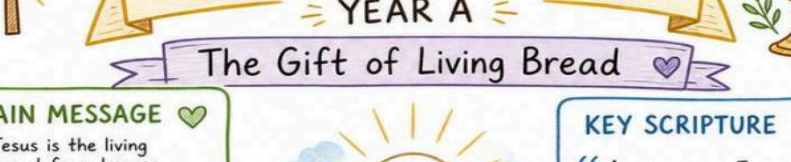
Pay close attention at Mass. Thank Jesus after receiving Communion.

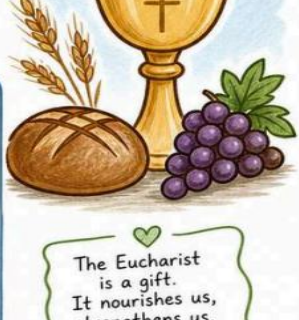

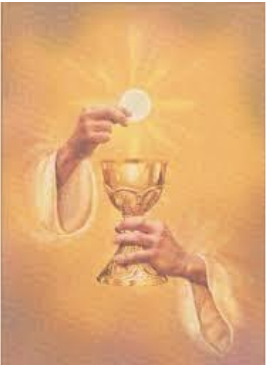
